IDENTIFICATION OF STUDENTS WITH GENDER DYSPHORIA

Parents/carers apply for enrolment of a student identifying with gender dysphoria, or who has gone or is going through a gender transition process

Parents/carers make a request for a student to be recognised by her affirmed gender

College Principal, Assistant Principal Students and College Counsellor meet with the parents/carers to evaluate the current information and begin a case management process to gather further documentation for evaluation and discernment. This document may include:

- a) A formal request from the parent/carer for the enrolment or recognition to proceed
- b) A report from GP or Paediatrician
- c) A report from Psychologist/Psychiatrist w
